Summery

Tarok is a beautiful boat with excellent sailing characteristics. We love it. It sails to windward like no other. Unlike many other Swan models, the cockpit is well protected and under most conditions you don't get splashed by seawater. Throughout our ownership It has been extremely well maintained, is well equipped and ready to go anywhere. It may seem tight regarding nowadays space expectations and that is true when work in tight corners is at hand. However, the designers have well thought out every detail and life aboard is surprisingly comfortable for 2-3 People, or even 4 for a week or two.

Of course, if you want to have everything you need a bigger boat. At the beginning we were a bit concerned but were soon surprised to find that much storing space, thanks also to the pronounced tumblehome. But you need to think – items which are not of everyday use need to be placed in less accessible places.

If we need hot water, we put the kettle on the stove. Not a big deal. We shower on deck with a sun shower bag. If it is too cold, like often during the many years we sailed in Newfoundland and Labrador, washing with a rag and warm water is nice, too. While sailing we don't need a hot cabin. But for a cold day at anchor or in harbor, a portable small 1500 W heater makes for a cozy atmosphere inside. At anchor, the Honda provides power quietly, placed on the foredeck.

We went adding stuff only step by step. When we got tired of hand steering under engine in Mediterranean calms, we thought an Autopilot might be a good addition to the Wind Vane. When – after a last star fix in the evening – we nearly hit an unlit Venezuelan Island in the middle of nowhere at midnight we got our first GPS. Despite my yearlong concern of not going to use Astro Navigation anymore. Which of course happened. Our first thick fog encounter in the busy entrance to Newport led to the immediate acquisition of a Radar. And so on ...

In short – we hope the next owner will have as much fun with Tarok as we did and give it the same love and care.
